“OPEN”

This is an Order in Council appointment pursuant to s. 86.1 of the *Courts of Justice Act*. You will require legal, adjudicative, mediation and administrative skills. Associate Judges perform judicial duties in civil, commercial, bankruptcy and family law proceedings in the Superior Court of Justice, exercising the jurisdiction assigned to Associate Judges.

At the direction of the Regional Senior Justice for the Southwest Region, you will primarily serve as the Registrar in Bankruptcy for Bankruptcy Division No. 35 with the powers and jurisdiction conferred by s. 192 of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act*. In addition to your role as Registrar, you may be assigned to conduct pre-trials or case conferences, and exercise case management and trial management functions in both civil and family proceedings. You may also be assigned to conduct references under the *Construction Act*.

LOCATION: 80 Dundas Street, London, Ontario, with some travel to other centres within the Southwest Region and to other regions, as assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS

Membership in good standing of the Law Society of Ontario for at least ten years; good judgment, creativity, strong interpersonal skills, effective organization and computer skills. This position requires a thorough knowledge of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* and related statutes and regulations. Oral and written proficiency in French would be an asset, as would knowledge of proceedings under the *Family Law Act* and related statutes, and the *Construction Act*. A “G” driver’s licence and the ability to travel to surrounding court locations and other regions are required.
